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In our Gospel assembly this, children explored how they can respond to Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who knows each of them personally.



"I am the good shepherd."

John 10:11

#### Children will understand:

- Jesus is the Good Shepherd, and we are His sheep.
- Jesus knows each of us individually.
- We can follow Jesus' example by caring for others.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus contrasts the ways in which a shepherd and a hired man act when the sheep in their care are in danger. We hear how, when the sheep are in danger, the hired man runs away, as opposed to the good shepherd who cares for the sheep. Jesus says that he is the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. Jesus gives us an example of how we are to care for

others. Whenever we care for others in ways that puts their needs before our own, we are following the example of Jesus.

I want to congratulate our two teams from St Benet's and St Edmund's who took part in the Rotary Club's inter school quiz this week. They represented both schools really well and were a pleasure to have participate in it.
