

During our training day, the staff brought a selection of books for history and geography to share across the federation to celebrate the creativity and depth of knowledge shown by the children last term. The expectation within our curriculum is to inspire in our children, through high challenge and use of authentic resources, to create beautiful work and develop independent thinking around this. We were also inspired through a talk from Sister Judith Russi about how we can develop and embed Catholic Social Teaching in our schools. This is the essence of what makes us one family under God as a Catholic school, what makes us special and what we do for our brothers and sisters because of this.

Part of this discussion, was to consider how we facilitate for our children to be ambassadors for change for our world. Therefore, each term I am going to pose a 'big question' to the classes and any child who wants to speak out around the topic will have the opportunity to prepare for and deliver a speech to the school at the end of the half term. I will let you know what the 'big question' is so you can help your child think about what this means to them and what they could do about it.

Unfortunately, we have started the term with some illness amongst staff in both schools, please keep them in your prayers and that we can all remain well for the remainder of this term.

As the colder weather comes into play this month, I am praying that we don't have heavy snow, although I am sure the children are doing the opposite! It is always a difficult decision to close the schools and I really dread this time of year for this reason. However, many of our staff drive a distance to get to school so for operational reasons I may need to fully close or partially close but I will always endeavour to give you as much notice as I possibly can through the website, school Facebook groups and the local Suffolk County Council website. If we do close we have the ability to move to online learning as we did during Covid lockdown.

Our new websites will be going live on 23<sup>rd</sup> January, we are so excited to share these with you and feel very proud of how they look and showcase both schools.

If you have a child who was born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2019 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2020 you must apply for a primary school place for the 2024/2025 school year by the closing date of 15<sup>th</sup> January 2024.

#### Forest School

They may need e.g. a spare pair of jogging bottoms when they get back. The Community Bus also asks that children have a clean pair of shoes/trainers to change into after the visit, before they get into the mini bus.
