How does the school know if my child needs extra help?

- Concerns may be raised by the class teacher, a member of support staff or by you as a parent or prospective parent
- Information from a previous school/nursery
- Termly pupil progress meetings to ensure all children are making good progress.
- Educational testing to identify learning needs may be carried out by the SENDCO
- The school will always discuss your child's needs with you and how to best support them

How will the school support my child?

- Quality First Teaching and adapted planning from the class teacher to meet individual needs
- The school follows a graduated approach of 'Assess, Plan, Do, Review' to support children with additional needs
- A Pupil Profile, including Steps to Success, identifies the child's needs and sets specific, measurable, achievable, relevant and timebased targets agreed between pupil, parent and school.
- Timed interventions to support needs may be delivered individually or in small groups.
- Assessment and support may be available from external services commissioned by the Trust or provided through Suffolk

St Benet's and St Edmund's Catholic Primary
Schools are part of the St John the Baptist Multi
Academy Trust. Schools in the Trust work
together to provide a similar approach to
meeting the needs of children with Special
Educational Needs and Disabilities. All of our
schools aim to be as inclusive as possible and to
